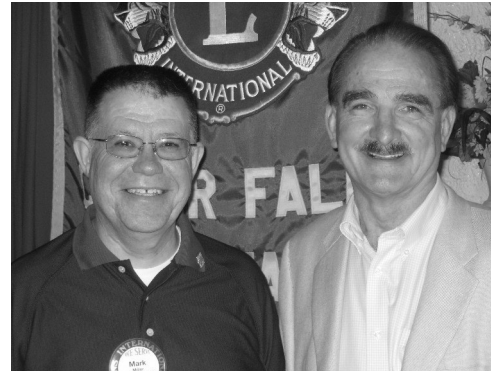

The Sturgis Falls Celebration Board of Directors annually selects three deserving high school seniors from the metropolitan area to receive a \$1,500 scholarship.
