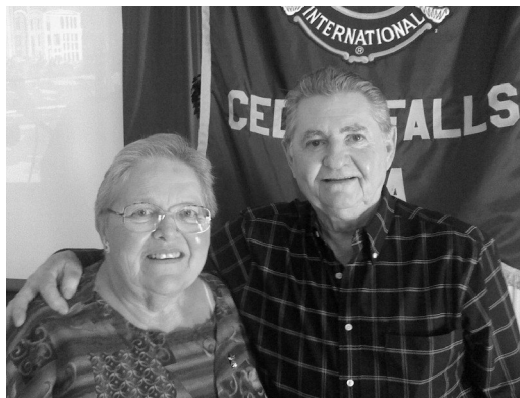

Doris Mauer spoke to the club about the history of the Women's Club and their current fund drive to complete improvements to the facility. The Women's Club was dedicated in 1929. The home was built in 1867 by Joseph T. Knapp and was secured for \$30,000. Located in the heart of Cedar Falls, the facility is home to various

community service groups including Lions, Kiwanis, Arcturus, Rotary, Sons of Norway, American Association of University Women and all Women's Club Activities. Other activities include wedding and graduation receptions and other similar events. Membership in the Cedar Falls Women's Club is open to all women. All meetings include a meal, friendship, a short meeting and a program. General club meetings are the first Wednesday at noon, September through May.

In 2004, an assessment of the clubhouse was completed. The most pressing need at the time was to provide handicap accessibility to the building and restrooms. Since the original assessment, repairs to the roof have been completed. Other work includes, repair of doors, windows and trim, parking lot and landscaping, replacing siding, upgrade plumbing, heating, cooling and electrical. The total cost for the entire project is estimated at \$907,000.
